RE: Updated Letter of Expectations for Kainga Ora – Homes and Communities

Thank you for your letter of 21 June 2024 setting out your expectations for kainga Ora for the year ahead.

I confirm that Kāinga Ora's intentions for 2024/25 align to the expectations and priorities you have outlined. While the Board is still in the process of being refreshed, steps have been taken to commence work on developing a credible plan to improve financial sustainability and the intention is to present this in line with the timeframe set of November 2024, working closely with the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development and Treasury. I will keep you updated on its progress. Given the obvious requirement for the new Board and I to have some time to come up to speed with all the issues, I would appreciate your acknowledgement that we will not have all the solutions and information you are seeking until later in the year.

There are three matters which warrant clarification arising from your Letter of Expectations.

Firstly, to note that, while we will look to deliver Crown-funded programmes and statutory obligations within the available budget, submitting on council Resource Management Act plan changes is not a statutory function or obligation and does not impact our ability to perform our functions and obligations for urban development and SDPs. At the lower funding level confirmed in Budget 2024/25, we will be unable to retain the capacity to perform this broadbrush role and will instead be submitting only on issues that are material to Kāinga Ora. If this is a concern, I would welcome a conversation with Ministers and our monitoring agencies.

Secondly, through discussions with HUD, we have clarified that our debt cap is still set at \$22.910b and that our forecast debt over the 2025/26 – 2027/28 period is \$21.1b.

Thirdly, as Kāinga Ora administers the IAF on behalf of Ministers we will ensure any material variations of funding agreements or housing outcomes are escalated to Ministers for decision, consistent with the Agency Agreement signed by the Crown and Kāinga Ora. We are unsure if Ministers are seeking something more than this.



Finally, I can confirm that Kāinga Ora will continue supporting the Tāmaki Regeneration Programme by having our Board monitor the progression of work to ensure Kāinga Ora and the Tāmaki Regeneration Company are reaching desired delivery outcomes. This is also likely an area for further discussion to ensure that this is the best use of each organisation's expertise into the future.

# UPDATED LETTER OF EXPECTATIONS FOR KAINGA ORA - HOMES AND COMMUNITIES

We are writing to you as the Responsible Ministers for Kainga Ora - Homes and Communities (Kāinga Ora) to outline detailed delivery expectations around Social Housing for the next two financial years.

As outlined in the Letter of Expectations sent to you an 21 June 2024, Ministers expect to receive a turnaround plan in November but in the interim period we understand the need for clear purchasing intentions for both 2024/25 and 2025/26 to enable you to progress projects to renew the portfolio (Area 1 of the Letter of Expectations refers).

Our understanding is that the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development has been working with Kainga Ora to establish an approach in line with Government decisions for social housing delivery.

The Government wants to ensure that Kāinga Ora's delivery of social housing places contributes to the Government's goal of reaching the number of households in emergency housing

As such, we are altering previous targets to align delivery efforts with regions most in need.

We also acknowledge that for 2025/26 in order to progress Large Scale Projects there is a need for demolitions in Auckland which will provide the opportunity to increase Auckland stock from 2026/27 onwards subject to approval of future renewal programmes.

We understand that you have already begun a process to assess the financial viability of pipeline projects and as Ministers we are keen to be kept informed through Officials of your progress in this area.

We expect the following deliverables to be accommodated within the debt forecast to June 2026 previously submitted as part of Budget 2024 and that both the renewal programme and retrofit programme are reporting quarterly to the Treasury under Cabinet Office Circular 23(9).

## Delivery to June 2025

We expect Kāinga Ora to deliver the following net social housing places by region for the year to June 2025

We acknowledge that there will be slight changes to the delivery profile as projects progress, which we expect the monthly reporting to Ministers to clearly identity risks and issues to ensuring these regional targets are met.

## Delivery to June 2026

We expect Kāinga Ora to deliver the following net social housing places by region for the year to June 2026.

We expect as part of the credible plan in November, further information is included on the demolition and sales approach being adopted to meet these targets acknowledging that the levels proposed within the delivery to June 2026 are at similar levels to past years.
