Thank you for your email of 7 August 2018 to Housing New Zealand requesting information under the Official Information Act 1982 about methamphetamine contamination in the Bay of Plenty (BOP).

Housing New Zealand has changed the way it approaches methamphetamine contamination in its homes. We have stopped ending tenancies for methamphetamine contamination. In addition, any household previously suspended has had the suspension withdrawn, and Housing New Zealand will not be collecting any outstanding debt relating to methamphetamine damage and remediation and will be refunding any debt already paid.

The Minister of Housing and Urban Development asked Housing New Zealand to produce a comprehensive report on our policies, processes, and the outcome of methamphetamine contamination in our properties. I have answered your individual questions below.

The data is provided by the Territorial Local Authorities (TLA) of Whakatane, Tauranga, Western BOP, Rotorua, Kawerau, and Opotiki unless otherwise stated.

... how many tenants were evicted from their Housing New Zealand homes in the Eastern Bay and Bay of Plenty because tests showed the presence of methamphetamine over the past three years? Can you break down the data for each year?

An eviction occurs where a court bailiff is authorised to obtain possession of a property after a tenancy has been ended by the Tenancy Tribunal, the landlord has an order for possession of the property, and the tenant has not vacated it. All evictions in the Bay of Plenty in 2015/16 and 2016/17 took place in Tauranga.

... provide the number and location of Housing New Zealand homes in the Eastern Bay and Bay of Plenty where methamphetamine was detected in the past three years, broken down into each year?

Housing New Zealand did not record the number of positive methamphetamine tests by TLA in 2015/16 and 2016/17. This information was recorded by region:

How much did Housing New Zealand spend on repairing houses in the Eastern Bay and Bay of Plenty where methamphetamine was detected in the past three years?

The figures below include costs to decontaminate properties and for repairs to bring them up to standard. Prior to mid-2016, Housing New Zealand did not centrally record these costs.
